Chapter 1

Be Brutally Honest

Generally, we do not think of ourselves as liars, but we lie more often than we would like to believe or admit. We lie about being on time, our age and weight and we even lie to the face of others about how they really look when asked. We also lie about our feelings. The Personality/Social Profile

Most online dating sites require you to fill out a personality or social profile. Some are pretty basic but in recent times the personality profile form/quiz has become so complex that like Benford's Law, most persons respond less by skipping questions as they get closer to the end of the form. There are others who will only subject themselves to filling out the required cells. This approach actually does more harm than good.

The personality/social profile section of the form is one of the most critical areas to ensure the right people are filtered for you. You should therefore, be brutally honest in this area. Think about it. Who will be seeing the information you place on the form anyway? The bots who process the online forms? The CIA or FBI? Who by the way, will not have you on their radar until you commit an offence that's worthy of their attention.

Being brutally honest is to your benefit. If you choose to lie about who you are, you may find yourself trying harder to fit in with the persons that were filtered for you based on fake preferences. You might even find yourself trying to be that fake person you wrote about on your profile page.

Like saying you're athletic and adventurous when you're a lazy couch potato. Who needs that kind of headache? At this stage of the dating game, honesty is the best policy. There will be times when you will have to bend the rules, but do not short-change this first step.



You need to be authentic about who you are. Also be as detailed as possible if the form permits. This will allow the algorithm of the site to better analyze and filter information in support of you finding your ideal partner. Now, there may be other areas in online dating where you need to be less than brutally honest, but the personality or profile section is not one of them and should not be compromised.

3 key benefits of being brutally honest

Benefit 1: The physical profile of persons will likely match what you really like and want. For example, ladies, if you prefer dark skinned, tall muscular men over light skinned short men, then saying so is best. If you have no physical preferences, then the option is there for you to choose. Please note however that not selecting features of your type will be more work for you in the end. Not having a type means the good, the bad and the ugly will be presented for you to then filter through. Yes, precious gems could be hidden among the numerous types of persons they are in the world, but do you have the time to meet them all? It is therefore advised that you choose a type and be brutally honest about it.

Benefit 2: For questions that ask about your own physical appearance it is good to be honest, even if you do not like the way you look. That way you won't need to explain yourself later as what they see will be what they get. Don't be shy about it either, its just an electronic form and the only discomfort to be experienced is when you upload your profile photo which we will get to later.

Benefit 3: By being honest, you will benefit from pre-filtering of suitable candidates that you can later sift and narrow even further. The aim of the personality form or quiz is to align you with persons who match your personality traits. Mark you, if they are lying, then you could get matched with someone less than ideal in reality. The same can happen to others if you lie about yourself on the form.

Chapter 2

Yes Catfish

This chapter heading might sound a little odd after being told to be brutally honest but hear me out. You need to catfish your profile photo but not in the way you think. You need to dumb down on your profile photo. Let me explain.

While you would love to put your best face forward, this is where you need to hold back a little.

Use nice images but make sure you are just as stellar in person.

The profile photo is the first thing a prospective buyer sees (so yes its all about the sale) and you are selling your assets and features in the hope that someone will like it enough to want to know more. You may be drop dead gorgeous but avoid using dramatic filters and boosters on your profile photo. If you are female, your attire from the bust up should reflect a little of your personality without being too boring or edgy and without revealing too much skin.

This serves as a form of validation to anyone who may have found you on another dating site. It can also bring a sigh of relief to know you are not masquerading as someone else on other sites. The similarities in how you present yourself on each dating site will display a form of authenticity. It is also important to share this fact with prospective suitors. It is ok to let them know they are not the only one you are dating online.

Chapter 3

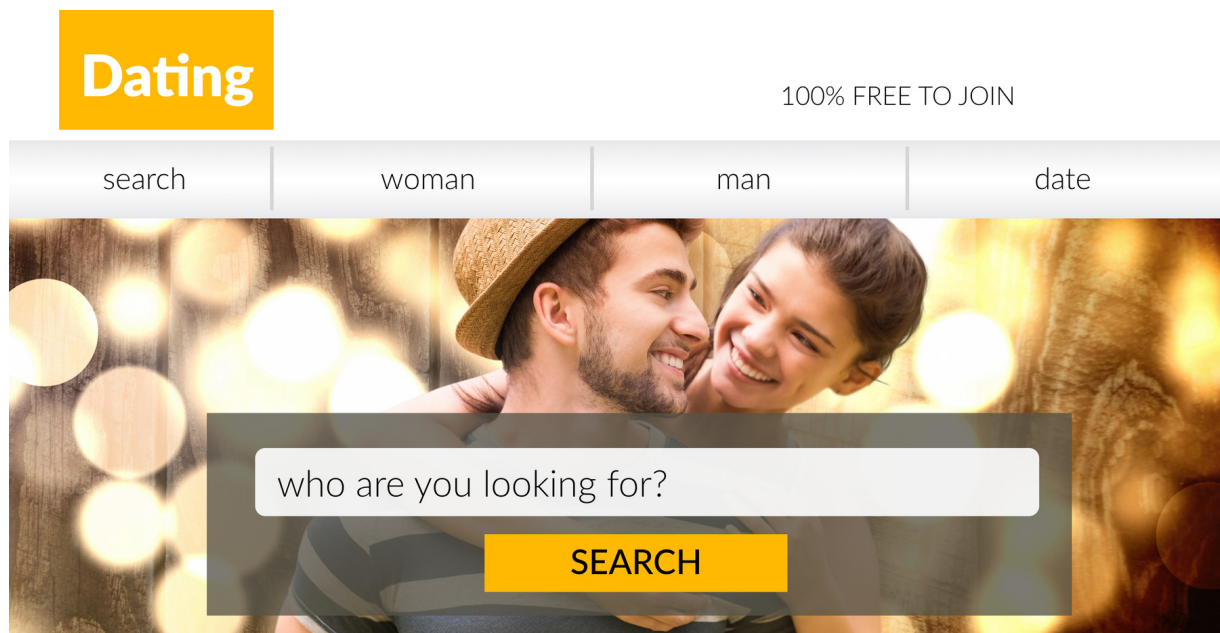
Chapter 4

Dating Sites

The communication styles and culture are even more complex for online dating. Here are five rules of engagement when communicating online. Disclaimer! 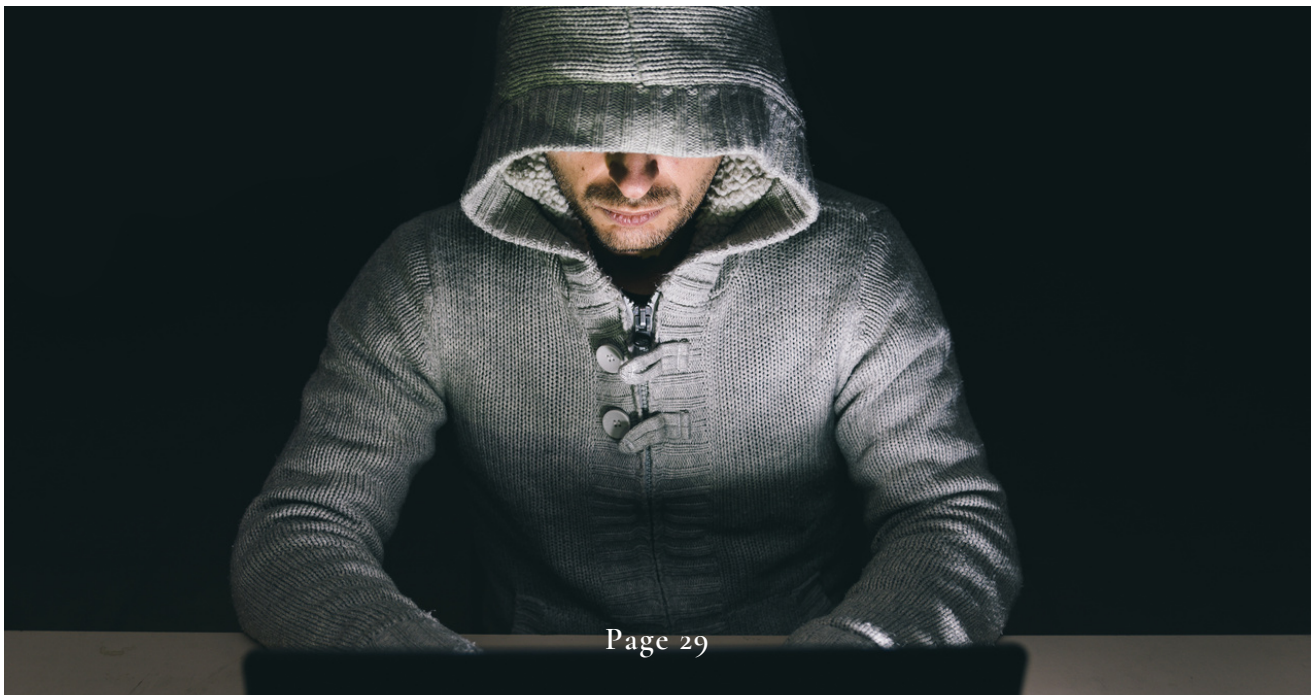

Chapter 8

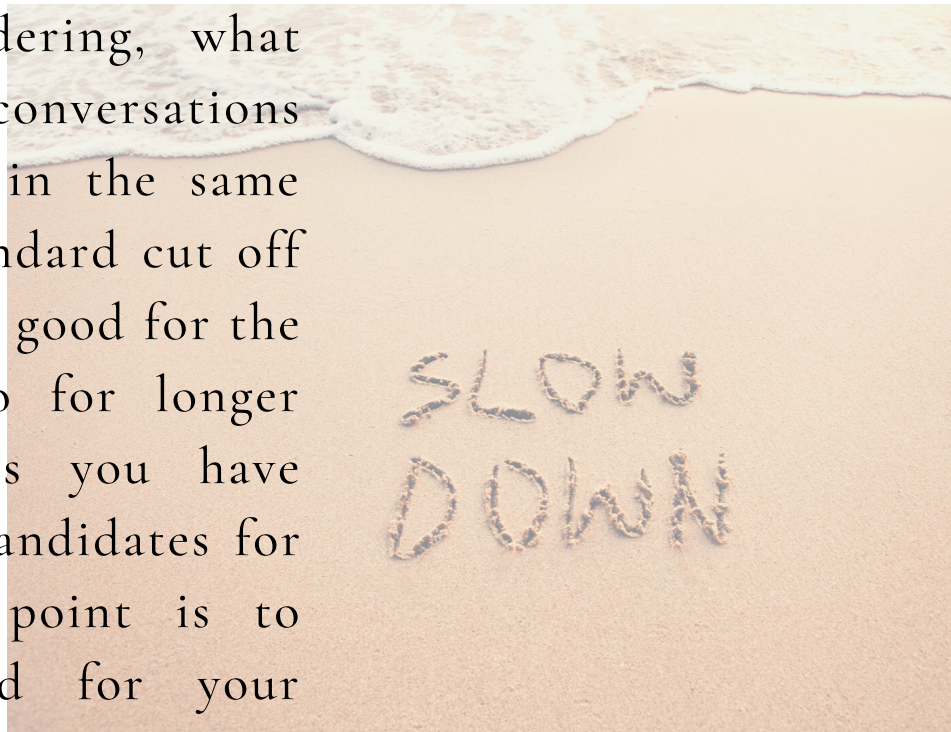
The Curfew

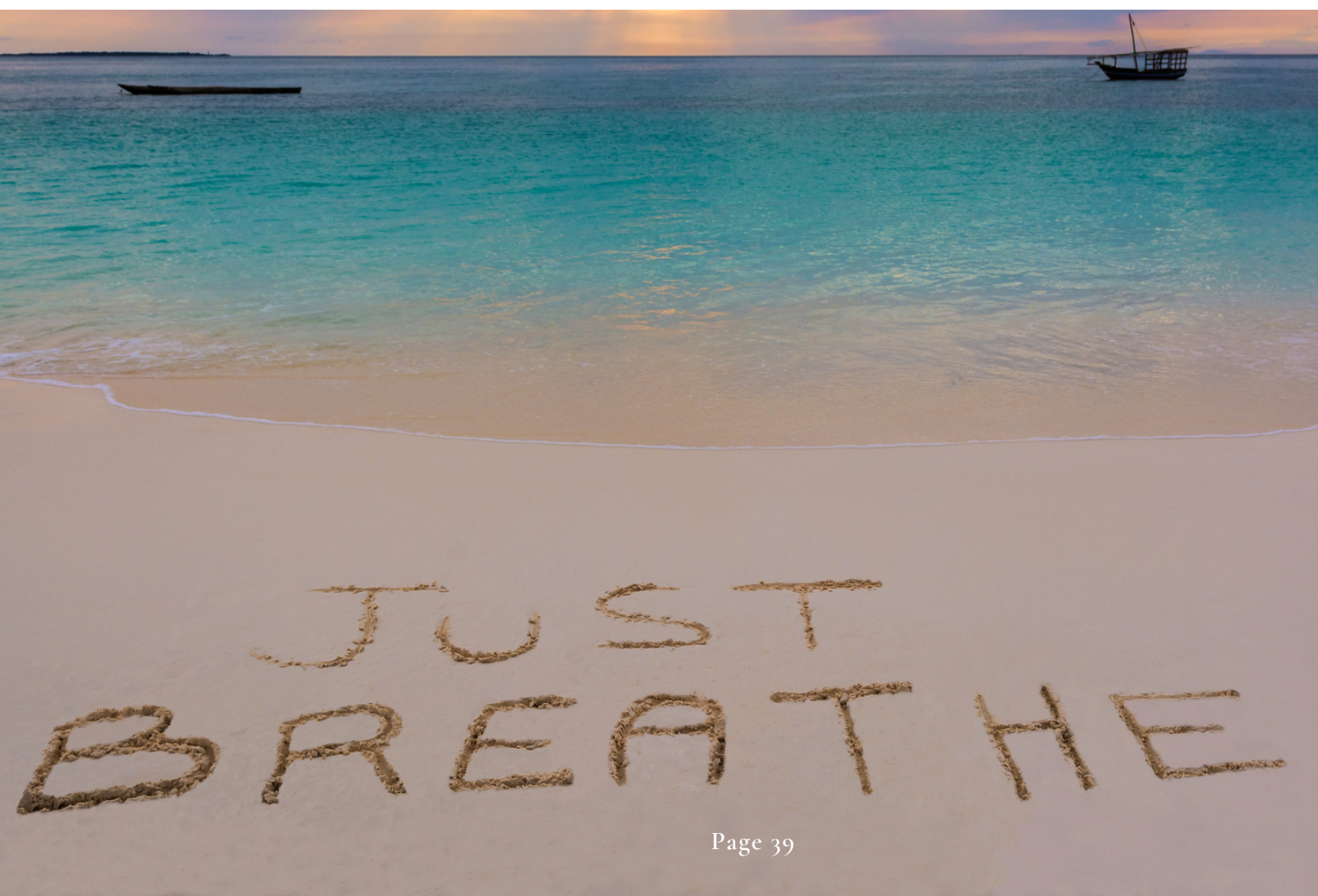
Chapter 10

Do Not Plan a Wedding

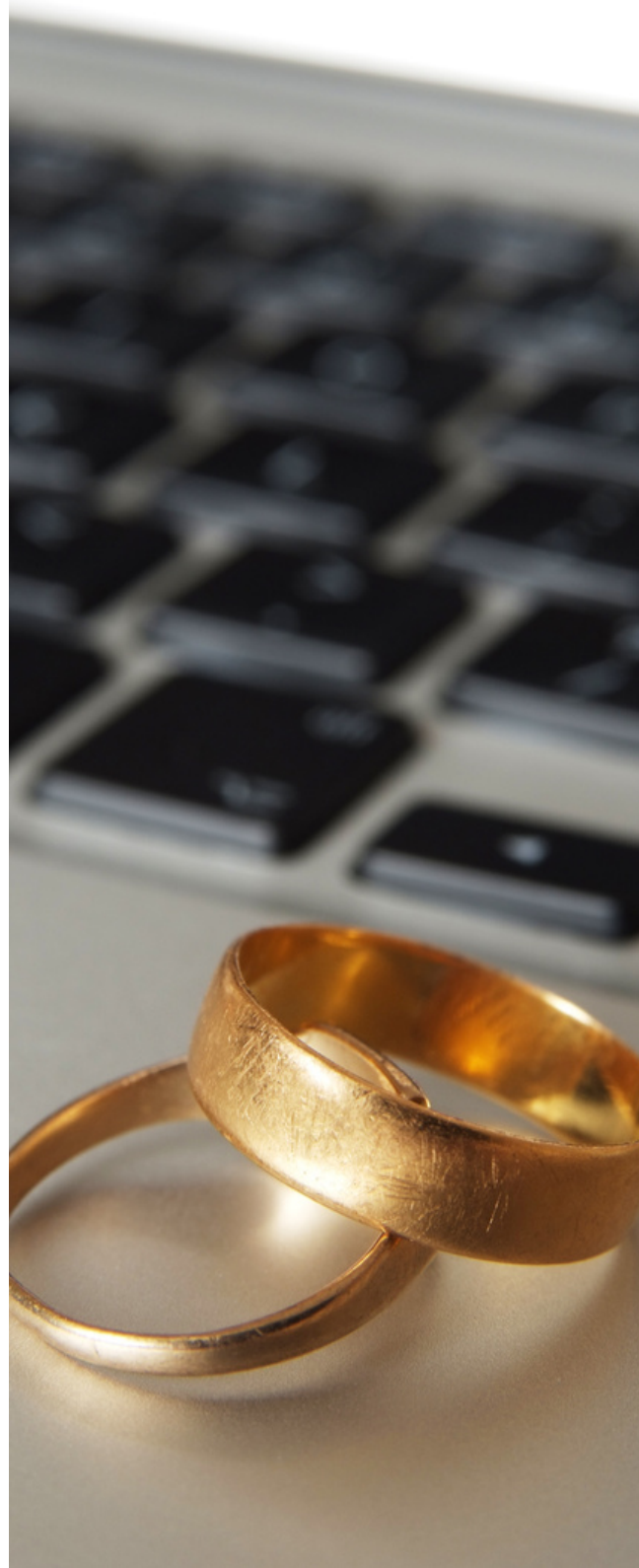
Here is my one condition.
